DOGS

Reports about misbehaving dogs continue to be the number one complaint received by the HOA management company, Highland Realty.

Common areas of the association are for the enjoyment of all residents. Dog owners are reminded that there are several HOA and city ordinances that must be observed at all times. Unleashed dogs and dog droppings continue to be a major community issue. All pet owers are reminded:

- ★ Dogs must be on a leash at all times; pets running free cause a nuisance and possible safety hazard to residents. Residents observing dogs off leash should call Thorton Animal Control at 720.977.5250 (office) or 720.977.5150 (dispatch).
- ★ Dog droppings must be picked up immediately both inside the community fence and on the street sides of the fence.
- ★ Dogs must not be tied outside at any time. Dogs left tied bark an create a community nuisance and also cause damage to the grass. Barking dogs should be reported to Thornton Animal Control (see above). According to city ordinance, it is unlawful for any owner or keeper of an animal to fail to exercise proper control of an animal to prevent it from becoming a public nuisance by excessive, continuious or untimely barking. Any animal owenr who fails to comply with this ordinance an is found guilty can be fined up to \$1,000.
- **★** Pet owners are responsible for any damages done to the community, including repairs to grass/sod.
- ★ Fines may be assessed to any pet owners who do not follow these or other HOA or city ordinances.
